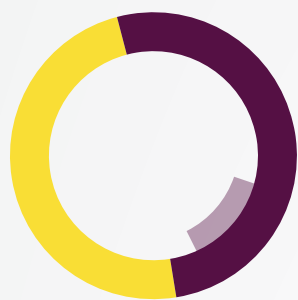


Most cities still have lagging own-source revenues in 2014.

Cities have the most taxing powers allowed by law due to the services required of them to be delivered to the people.



- ▶ **75 out of 144 cities** have locally sourced income still lagging behind. Their annual regular incomes in 2014 are below the national average of 30% ratio of locally sourced revenues to annual regular income.
- ▶ **22 out of the 75** are even high income class cities.
